# <u>CJSF CLARIFICATION for Article V - HONOR MEMBERSHIP - Section 1</u>

Students in semester system without ninth grade must earn CJSF membership in any THREE of the four semesters of 7th and 8th grades. This means that the three semesters may include either or both semesters of 8th grade, not just the first semester of 8th grade; so the second semester of eighth grade must be considered, if necessary. CJSF bylaws must be consistent with CSF bylaws which requires the consideration of the final senior report card, if necessary, for Sealbearer/Life Membership.
