

IDEAS FOR RECRUITING MEMBERS

- Classroom presentations "What is CISF?"
- Hallway flyers
- Morning (PA) announcements
- Daily bulletin announcements
- Electronic Marquee messages
- Club rush
- Live school television broadcast (if applicable)
- Principals' (weekly) messages to parents
- PTSA newsletter announcements
- Invite students to apply via email, letters home, etc.

Note: Publicize well so students have adequate notification. Informing parents may help with recruitment.

- Open to current or former CSF or CJSF advisers.
- Appointment is for three years.
- Committee members serve as voting members of the CSF Board.
