

People here prefer to work with objects, things, machines, tools, have mechanical ability; prefer plants, animals, and being outdoors; working with their hands.




I

People here are interested in science, logic; they like to analyze, evaluate, and solve problems; they like learning and understanding the causes of events.




A

People here are artistic; they like change; using imagination and creativity; using their feelings and intuitions; they like working in jobs where they are free to set their own schedules and work creatively.




C

Questions to Research or Ask the College Representative

Academic Questions:

- Will I have to take an online course? night course?
- How difficult is it to change my major? Do you have special programs example BA/MBA, BA/JD? Can I double major? Be Undecided? Create my major?
- What is the largest class I will have? smallest? Do professors or graduate students teach courses?
- What does it mean to be a "pre major"? ex: pre-business
- Do you have a study abroad program? Does my adviser help me with my plans?
- What is the percentage of freshmen returning for sophomore year?
- What percentage of students graduates in four years? five years? six years?
- What is the percentage of students getting jobs after they graduate? What is the percentage going on to graduate study?

Non-Academic Questions:

- Will I be able to see a dorm room on my tour?
- What percentage of students live on campus?
- What is the availability of dorms for freshman?
- What kinds of extracurricular activities does the college offer?
- What do the students do on weekends? What is available for students in the surrounding community? Are there shuttles or buses for students?
- How is the food? If necessary, ask about special dietary accommodations such as being a vegetarian, which meal plan is most often used by freshman?
- Ask a student, "What do you like best about being here"? and "What do you like least"? "Why did you choose this college"?

To-Do List for College Visits:

- Look online for information regarding campus tours.
- Check reports regarding campus safety.
- If classes are in session, see if you can sit in on a freshman class or a class you are interested in majoring in.
- If possible, eat a meal in the dining hall. See a dorm room.

College Fairs are a great opportunity to learn more about colleges you have already researched or discover a college you knew nothing about before now. Take the time to talk with the college representatives- they are eager to meet you and answer any questions you have. If you need ideas of what to ask, we have a list of suggested questions below.

- What are the most important factors in the admissions process? GPA? SAT scores? Honors and AP classes? Activities?
- What is the average accepted GPA? Is there a minimum GPA for any major?
- How large are your freshman classes? Your upper-division classes? Are the courses taught by professors or graduate students primarily?
- Are any of your majors impacted? (Number of applicants exceeds available spaces, and the difficulty of being accepted into that major is increased.)
- What kind of financial aid and scholarships do you have available? Do you award merit scholarships? Is there a special application process for merit aid?
- What percent of freshman get some form of financial aid? How will my financial aid package change my sophomore year?
- Who do I contact for a campus visit? Do you have a "Preview Day"?
