

Qualifications for CSF Semester Membership

A. To qualify for CSF membership, follow these guidelines:

- 1. **No more than five (5) courses may** be used to qualify.
- 2. A student must have taken a minimum of three (3) courses from LISTS I and II; at least two (2) of these three courses must be from LIST I only. (However, seniors applying at the start of their second semester or at graduation may use three (3) courses from LIST II and none from LIST I.) Additional courses may be taken from any LIST, including LIST III.
- 3. A student must earn a **minimum of 10 points in courses from any LISTS (I, II, or III**). The first four (4) points must be from LIST I (unless you are a senior applying for membership in January or May).

Qualifications for CSF Semester Membership

В.

- 1. Seven (7) points must be either ALL from LIST I or 4 points from LIST I and 3 points from LIST II, and the remaining points may come from any LIST (I, II or III).
- 2. No CSF points are given for P.E., courses taken in lieu of P.E., subjects repeated to improve a grade, courses involving clerking and office/teaching assisting, and courses taken on a pass/fail basis.

Qualifications for CSF Semester Membership

C. CSF points are granted as follows:

- 1. grade of **A** = 3 CSF points
- 2. grade of $\mathbf{B} = 1$ CSF point
- 3. grade of C = 0 CSF points
- 4. grade of **D** or **F** in any course disqualifies the student from the current semester membership
- 5. One additional point shall be granted for a grade of **A or B** in **AP, IB, and UC Honors** courses on List I and II only, up to a maximum of two points per semester. No additional points shall be granted for any courses on List III. College/Dual Enrollment courses are not eligible for additional points for CSF membership.

Qualifications for CSF Semester Membership

D. Also remember:

- 1. Semester membership is based on work done in the previous semester. Summer School and intersession courses may NOT count for CSF membership.
- 2. Students must reapply each semester.
- Refer to the Approved CSF Course Lists For your school (Lists I, II and III).



Qualifications for CJF Semester Membership

Requirements for Semester/Trimester Membership

CJSF Membership is based on scholarship and is gained after qualifying grades are earned each semester/trimester. In order to become a member, the student must submit an application each semester the student is eligible. A point system specified in the CJSF State By-Laws establishes the membership requirements.

A student establishes membership by earning academic points. The number of points earned must be twice the number of academic subjects in which the student is enrolled, i.e., 10 points must be earned by a student enrolled in 5 eligible subjects, 12 points for a student with 6 subjects, etc. A minimum of 4 academic subjects is required.

Qualifications for CJF Semester Membership

No CJSF points shall be given for Physical Education, courses involving clerking or office/teacher assisting, and courses taken on a pass/fail basis.

Grades earned in summer school courses, repeated or remedial subjects shall not count for CJSF points, but grades in these subjects must be a C or better.

CJSF students may become Honor Award Members. Those who qualify have the Honor Award seal placed on their certificate of promotion and are eligible to wear the CJSF gold pin.

CJSF students may be disqualified from membership based on poor citizenship. It is the adviser and principal's prerogative to determine disbarment.

Qualifications for CJF Semester Membership

CJSF semester/trimester points are calculated based on grades as follows:

A = 3 CJSF points

B = 1 CJSF point

1 extra point for an A or a B in an AP, IB, or Honors-designated course, not to exceed two such points per semester/trimester

C or Pass = 0 CJSF points

D or F in any subject shall disqualify the student from membership for the semester/trimester.

No CJSF points shall be given for Physical Education, courses involving clerking or office/teacher assisting, and courses taken on a pass/fail basis.

Grades earned in summer school courses, repeated or remedial subjects shall not count for
